FSW L.E.A.D.S.

FSW L.E.A.D.S is a new college-wide certified student leadership program in which guest leaders from around the community give speeches and seminars at FSW. The program's main objective is build leadership skills in our students while simultaneously stimulating engagement in the community both on and outside of campus. Mr. Gregory F. Burton, Sr. is a senior partner in TNG associates as well as a key role in FSW L.E.A.D.S. program. Burton is a former educator and broadcaster whose highly energetic personality allowed him to teach a wide range of topics to a wide array of students. He has trained students, teachers, administrators, executives, and others. Furthermore, he has lead youth diversity retreats, youth leadership programs, presented keynote speeches, and facilitated many youth business simulation workshops at schools and universities. Every time FSW L.E.A.D.S. meets, there is a central topic of the session that always correlates with leadership skills.

For example, some sessions might include guest senators speaking about the importance of leadership in the government whereas another session might include a guest speech from a doctor or a nurse who discusses the importance of leadership in the medical field. Each session, students leave with a better understanding of what it means to be a leader in the workforce and in the community. If the student attends a total of nine sessions, they are eligible to attend a graduation ceremony at the end of the year in which they are recognized for their commitment to striving to become a stronger leader. FSW is pleased with the success the program has had on their campus this far and looks forward to the growth of this program in the future.

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
